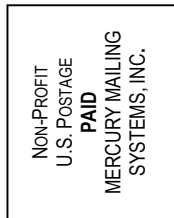

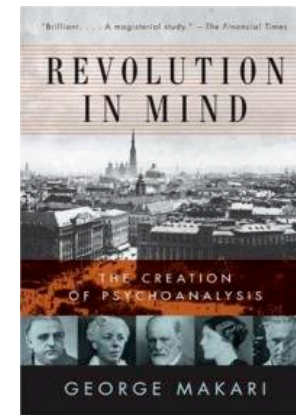

Join us for a day of intellectual and clinical discussion of the highest order, as we explore the real history of “the dangerous method” with George Makari, director of Cornell’s Institute for the History of Psychiatry. In his morning lecture, Dr. Makari will outline “*Revolution in Mind*,” his ground-breaking book tracing the origins and historical development of psychoanalysis out of its roots in European psychiatry and psychology, through Freud’s founding of the discipline, to the various wars of succession that transformed psychoanalysis from a movement based on Freud’s singular genius to the dynamic and diverse profession it is today. In the role of intellectual historian, Dr. Makari documents psychoanalysis’s genesis, in which intellectual differences and interpersonal conflicts intertwine. Following his talk, eminent psychoanalytic historians Peter Loewenberg and James Fisher will join Dr. Makari in a discussion of this fascinating history. In the afternoon, Dr. Makari will present a new paper entitled, “The Paradoxes of the Enlightenment: The Place of Psychoanalysis in Modern Culture.” Morris Eagle will be the discussant for this session.

### About the Presenters

**George Makari, MD**, is director of Cornell’s Institute for the History of Psychiatry, associate professor of psychiatry at Weill Medical College, adjunct associate professor at Rockefeller University, and a faculty member of Columbia University’s Psychoanalytic Center, where he underwent his analytic training.

**Peter Loewenberg, Ph.D.**, is emeritus professor of history at UCLA and was Dean and Chairman of the Education Committee and Director of the Training School of the Southern California Psychoanalytic Institute and the New Center for Psychoanalysis, Los Angeles, 2001-2006. He is the co-editor of *One Hundred Years of the IPA*, and author of *Decoding the Past*, and *Fantasy and Reality in History*.

**David James Fisher, Ph.D.** is clinical instructor, Department of Psychiatry, UCLA School of Medicine, senior faculty member of the New Center for Psychoanalysis, and Training and Supervising Analyst, Institute of Contemporary Psychoanalysis in Los Angeles. He is the author of *Bettelheim: Living and Dying, Cultural Theory and Psychoanalytic Tradition*, and *Romain Rolland and the Politics of Intellectual Engagement*.

**Morris Eagle, Ph.D.** is emeritus professor at The Derner Institute for Advanced Psychological Studies at Adelphi University and on the faculty at Cal Lutheran, LAISPS, and NCP. He has authored *From Classical to Contemporary Psychoanalysis, Recent Developments in Psychoanalysis*, and over 250 articles and chapters in edited books.
